EASTON

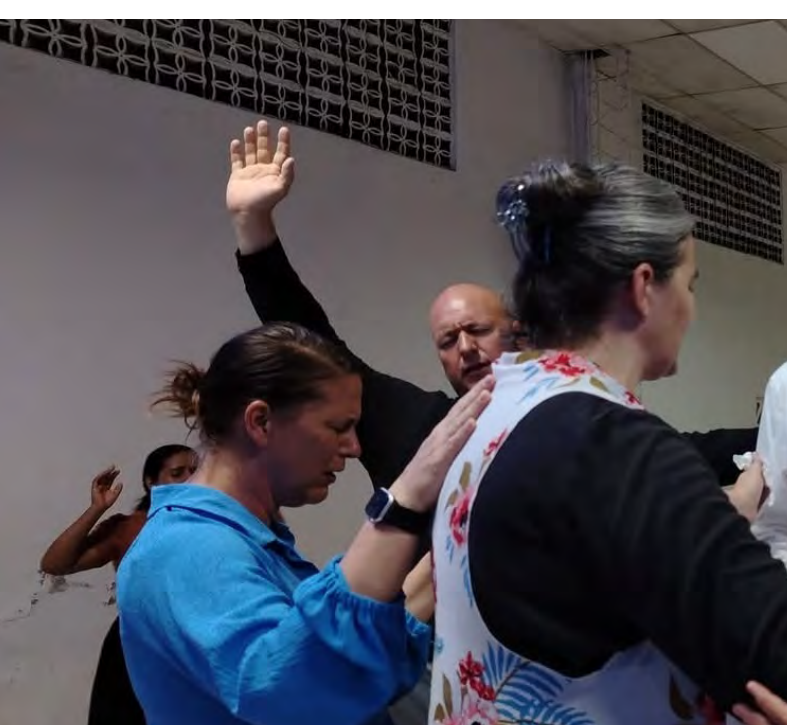
Easton wrote his first sermon this month with 5 stories based off of Matthew 6:21.
