The people we have had the opportunity to talk to about God are so hungry. They deeply desire a relationship with Him, which is unusual in a culture so shaped by Orthodoxy. People here are searching for something, and it is evident. Moments like these remind me why I'm here.

God has also been teaching me personally. In full transparency, there was a day this month when I felt a little down about whether I was truly making a difference. On some mission fields, you hear stories of hundreds being baptized or receiving the Holy Ghost. That hasn't been the case here, and I poured my heart out to God about it. That same day He brought me to 1 Corinthians 15:58 (ESV): "Therefore, my beloved, be steadfast, immovable, always abounding in the work of the Lord, knowing that in the Lord your labor is not in vain." It was exactly what I needed to be reminded of: even if I don't see a single soul receive salvation while I'm here, the work is not in vain. Every post, every prayer walk, every conversation is part of preparing the soil for what God will do in the future.
