**Big news!** We have changed church facilities! We were meeting in a community center in a residential area. The area management wanted to improve security for the community with automatic gates and keyed locks. That was great for the residents but it was becoming a hindrance for both the church members and church visitors. We definitely needed a change that would better accommodate us.

Pastor Poblete and his son-in-law, Leo, were passing by a church building in the same neighborhood that looked like it wasn't being used and Leo decided to try to get more information about it. He made contact with the owner and they had a story to tell!

The pastor, who is about 80 years old and owns the property, has an independent Jesus' Name church that has dwindled to only eight members because most of the congregation have moved away from the city or out of the country. He really wanted to ensure that the property remained a church used for God's glory but didn't know what to do. So God answered prayer and he has leased us the property for 4 years!

The new location is very close to where we were meeting. There's parking available, and it's located just one building away from the corner of one of the main city thoroughfares. The location couldn't be much better! We have obtained approval to renovate the interior but I'll save some of those details for next month after we have taken a few more steps! We are so excited Please help us pray that all the details continue to come together smoothly.

We mentioned last month that our private Spanish language tutor is in Spain for a year. Her boyfriend/partner is staying behind and maintaining their apartment. (YES, we're praying for salvation and some wedding bells for them!) The church is literally down and around the corner from their home, and when we told her about it she said she knew the church. She does receive



the recorded church teachings even in Spain, and she has had some questions about God's requirements so we are hoping and praying that the Lord will open their hearts to receive all that he has for them in him! This is "fishing" with a hook and line, not a net, but God knows how to catch 'em! Praise God!

We just finished the teaching series on the Book of Revelation. It has been well-received and the church is anticipating the next series. I'm taking a short break while I prepare the next series of lessons on the book of 1st Corinthians. Please pray for clarity and direction as these new

They should be ready at the end of the month and Pastor Poblete and I are working out the best schedule. 


Alternative missionary house pet/neighbor

Today, the building is used for cultural exhibitions and art events. Its most famous contempory is the Eiffel Tower in Paris, France.
