This past month has been filled with planning, preparing, dreaming big, celebrating, and carrying a deep sense of anticipation as we get ready for this move. **Our first service will be March 8th.**

Our current building has had its challenges. It hasn't been perfect. But it has been a place of salvation, transformation, healing, and where we truly became a family. As we say goodbye to that location, another UPCI Spanish church will move in and we will still have an apostolic presence in that area!

In the last four years, we've grown from 60 to 150 people. And we are confident that this new season will be marked by the miraculous, abundance, growth, and the blessing of God.
