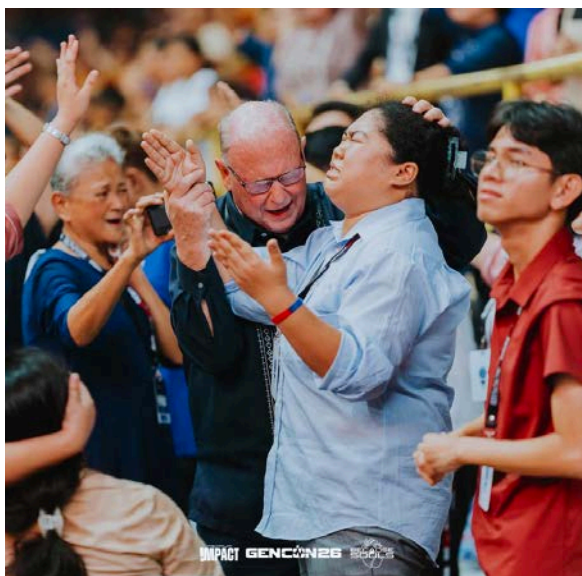


DEAF MINISTRY REAPS HARVEST!

VISION FULFILLED IN MAY

May was a month of evangelism and fulfilled vision, with eight Deaf individuals filled with the Holy Ghost and six people baptized—five Deaf and one hearing.

General Conference was marked by powerful preaching and an overwhelming presence of the Holy Ghost. Fourteen Deaf individuals and nine interpreters attended; six Deaf people received the Holy Ghost, and three were baptized.



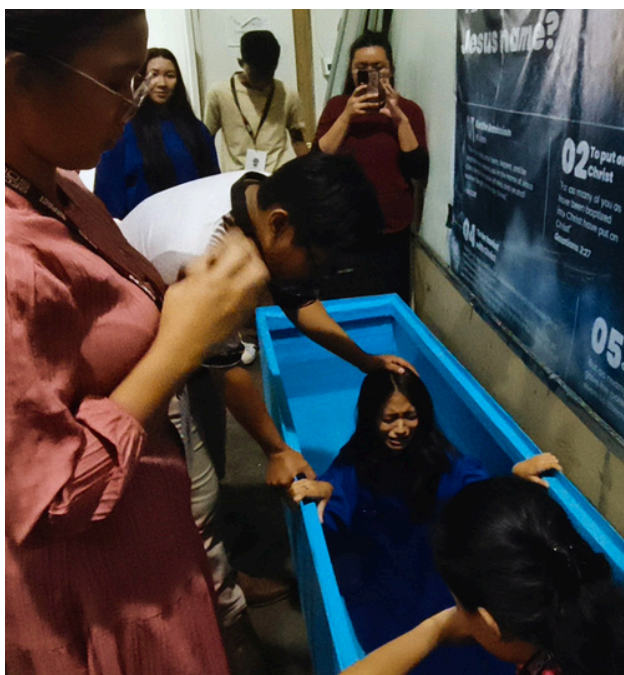


VISAYAS WITNESSES DEAF REVIVAL

We received a report that one Deaf woman received the Holy Ghost during the Western Visayas District Ladies Conference, and Deaf revival continued in Tagbilaran, Bohol, where two Deaf women were baptized. We attended the UPC church in Cebu for their Mother's Day service where 17 Deaf were present.

FAITH GROWS IN EASTERN VISAYAS

At the Eastern Visayas District Youth Camp, a Deaf man received the Holy Ghost, and the daughter of Deaf parents was baptized. She has attended church in Tagbilaran since February and is already helping interpret for her parents.

Greetings in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ.

This is to formally communicate the decision of the Executive Board regarding the proposal to institutionalize the DEAF Evangelism Ministry as part of the UPCPI structure.

After careful review, discussion, and consideration, it was unanimously decided that the DEAF Evangelism Ministry shall be placed under the supervision and advisory of the Home Missions Division.

The decision was made based on the following rationale:

First, the primary objective of the DEAF Evangelism Ministry is to reach out to the deaf community and win them to Christ. This objective is directly aligned with the mission and purpose of the Home Missions Division, particularly in the area of evangelism.

Second, not all local churches currently have a DEAF Ministry. In churches where such a ministry already exists, it may be placed under the Outreach Department or a similar ministry structure of the local church.

Third, the Executive Board also considered the possible burden this may place on our constituents, especially if additional fundraising projects will be required to support a separate institutional structure for this ministry.

Therefore, the Executive Board has unanimously resolved that the DEAF Evangelism Ministry will be placed under the supervision and advisory of the Home Missions Division.

We deeply appreciate the burden, passion, and dedication of the DEAF Evangelism Ministry in reaching the deaf community with the gospel of Jesus Christ. We trust that, under the guidance of the Home Missions Division, this ministry will continue to grow, be strengthened, and become more effective in fulfilling its God-given purpose.

May the Lord continue to bless your labor for His Kingdom.
