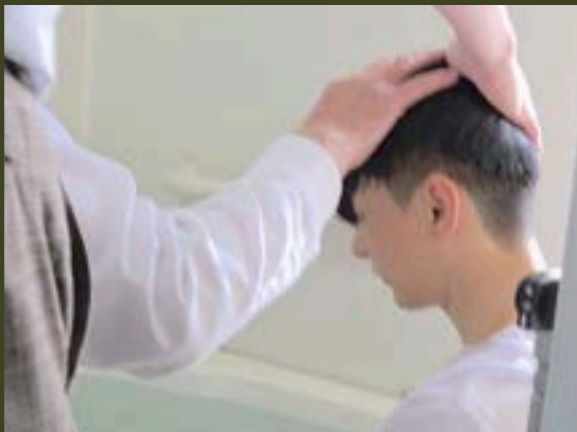
PROPRESENTER
