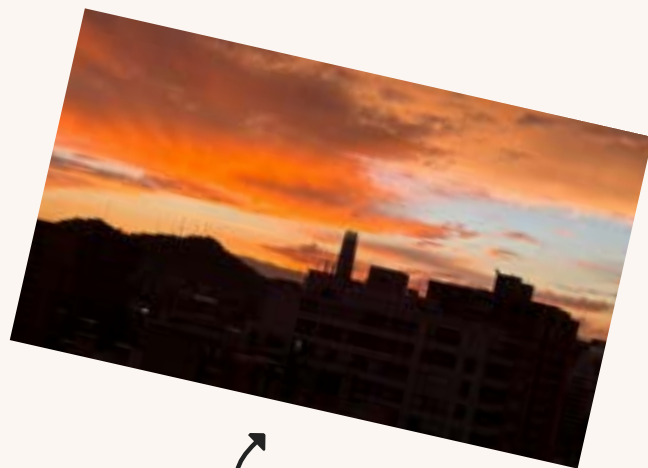

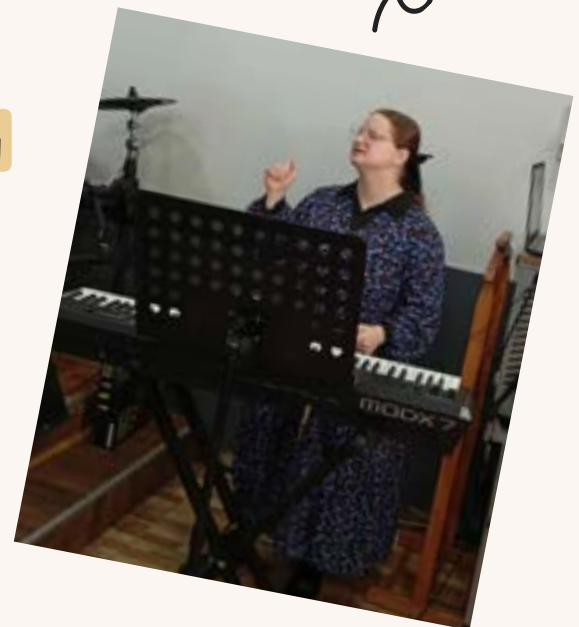
Between three main services and a Saturday morning devotional, we had an amazing weekend at Ladies Camp! The theme of this year's camp was "Vessels of Clay."
